





### Evaluation

#### **Evaluation of the work on Elements**

#### Q 1

- Involvement in schools stayed as it was before (5 classes)
- More involvement of external organisations and more activities outside school

#### Q 2

- Meetings, fixing of agreements, exchange of materials, reading the blog and take ideas...
- Problems: Diversity of the theme
  - We lost contact during the work

### Q 3

- Activity-orientated work allowed great experiences and gave motivation to teachers and pupils
- Division of classes into smaller groups allowed a successful way of learning
- Collaboration inside the classroom-teams by working on the same theme enriched the teamwork



### Evaluation

#### **Difficulties**

- Time pressure and the clashing of the project work with the schoolyear finishing work
- Loosing contact and the feeling of being part of a group / project

### Q 4

- All agreements of the april-meeting were considered.
- Every class did project work in three or more curricular subjects.
- Classes did more outside activities than before.
- Teachers felt themselves more open-minded for new ideas.

### Agreements for the future

- More presentations from pupils for pupils (weekly assembly)
- Change of meeting structure for less workload (and to reach more colleagues)
- Use project work to support new staff and to integrate them into the school-community
- Founding a WhatsApp-group for material exchange


